Subject: Draft Conclusions on the opportunities of the bioeconomy in the light of current challenges with special emphasis on rural areas

Excellency,

We have been informed that the Council of the European Union was considering adopting conclusions on the opportunities of the bioeconomy in the light of the current challenges, under the aegis of your Presidency.

As sector groups of Cefic (The European Council of Chemical Industries) representing the leading producers of biobased chemicals in Europe, we warmly welcome the forthcoming adoption of these conclusions. We share the vision that a blossoming bioeconomy is instrumental to achieving many of the EU ambitions, especially on the climate front, but also to ensure rural livelihoods and increase Europe's strategic autonomy.

We wish that the ongoing discussions will allow you to consider and include the following aspects as well:

- The contribution of the bioeconomy to the “defossilisation” of the economy and to sustainable carbon cycles
- The contribution of the bioeconomy to reducing the dependence of Europe on imports of raw materials, products and energy, in particular fossil ones, from overseas, drawing lessons from the Covid outbreak and, more recently, of the attack on Ukraine
- The positive contribution that biobased, and/or biodegradable and/or compostable materials can offer to reduce negative impacts on the environment, e.g., the presence of persistent microplastics in soils
- The importance of lifting the regulatory bottlenecks to innovation, scale-up and investments into the bioeconomy in Europe
- The urgency to improve the knowledge- and data-base on the bioeconomy in Europe, since better data will be instrumental to providing evidence of the sustainability, market relevance and many economic, social and environmental amenities that the bioeconomy can provide to Europe
- The need to secure a stable, fair and competitive access to carbon neutral energy and bio-based raw materials, as a precondition to attract production investments in Europe




We are of course at your disposal to further exchange on these various topics and look forward to a successful adoption of these conclusions.
